This issue we have a listing of Masonic medals of Oregon. Additions and corrections are welcome. Still to come is a list of British Columbia Masonic pieces and then a list of Oregon scrip items. Listings of any Northwest numismatic items are welcome. Just send the Trail along to the PNNA Prez and we will publish them.

We noticed in an issue of Paper Money, an ad offering for sale a \$10 note from the Portland Business College 1866. The note has a mining scene to the left of the note. We have been trying to gather information on early notes of the Northwest, say before 1900. We know of five Wash. Territory National Bank Notes, one or two Idaho Territory No Notes, the Cissna and Lauridsen scrip of 1893 or thereabout, the Puget Sound Cooperative Colony, some pieces from the 1893 bank closure period, and a piece of Commissioners Scrip apparently ussued for the Trans-Mississippi Exposition in Omaha by the Washington Legislature. Does anyone have anything else to report? Northwest collector Byron Johnson is running this year for ANA Board. Those wishing to nominate him, either clubs or individuals, can send nominations to ANA Headquarters in Colorado Springs. It should be an active election this year in ANA with competition again for ANA President. George Hatie and Virgil Hancock are vieing for the post..... The PNNA is holding their first school for exhibit Judges at the University Coin Club Exhibition March 2nd at the Lake City Community in Seattle. Their show runs two days, March 1st and 2nd. If you wish to learn more about how to judge exhigits or just how to improve your own exhibits, then give the class a try. Again we use the same abgreviation system as before: K-Copper, B-brass, Br-bronze, A-aluminum, WM-white metal, and Sv-silver. A piece listed as a shekel has an irregular scalloped edge. All other pieces are round unless indicated. Some of our diameter listings may be wrong as some are based on rubbings and other reports by mail.

Then they split all the chapters into the provinces and renumbered them. But some go by their original numbers and some go by both numbers. I like to keep them in numerical order and I hope to figure them out by next time.

I hope these lists are of use to you in your collecting. I have always found it easier to go after an item if I know it exists. I started collecting just the Washington State Masonic medals using the PNNA List. I now have about 60 different pieces plus other pieces not chapter pieces.

In order to understand some of the symbols on Masonic medals, we recommend you ask ANA about the Dr Wright article on them in The Numismatist. It is available in reprint at a nominal price from ANA headquarters. It tells you what some of the devices used mean. Why a mallet and chisel? What does the keystone mean? Look it up and enjoy your collection more.

All for this time. Don't forget the 1975 PNNA Convention to be held in Pasco on May 16, 17 and 18. Maybe we can see a Masonic medal exhibit.
