The awards are \$100-\$75-\$50 for the top three club efforts. The annual theme does not have to be part of your effort; if you have an already-established program for promoting coin collecting in your community that does not refer directly to the annual NCW theme, it is still acceptable for consideration. Send a report of your club's efforts to Larry Rowe, NCW Judge, at PO Box 61621, Vancouver, WA 98666 not later than 31 May.

Remember that the ANA also gives awards for NCW promotion excellence. If your club belongs to the ANA, submit a report to the Outreach Department to be considered for this award.

Classes and Coins in Colorado ANA Summer Seminar 2007

The annual ANA Summer Seminar provides an excellent opportunity to immerse yourself in the world of numismatics, and in a beautiful and relaxing location. I was grateful to have been awarded the 2007 PNNA scholarship and attended session I of the Seminar in June. My stay at the Antlers Hilton Hotel in Colorado Springs was very comfortable, and the ANA staff saw that we were well provided for during the class sessions and group meals at the nearby Colorado College campus.

I had selected Allen Berman's "Coins of the Middle Ages" course as my first choice, but it was unfortunately cancelled for this session. I was given my second choice, "Collecting Coins of the World." There were two co-instructors—George Cuhaj (of Krause Publications) and Emmett McDonald. The material for this course covered a wide range of historical periods and events in many parts of the world. As the various topics were presented, coins of the times and places being discussed were passed around. We were introduced to some basic attribution skills, and interesting characteristics of the coins were pointed out. The attendees of this class, and of the Summer Seminar in general, were a diverse group comprised of young and old, experienced and new collectors, and of those having various numismatic interests.

Beyond the class itself, an interesting part of the experience was the opportunity to spend time with and meet many of the big names in numismatics. This was on the eve of the "revolution" that occurred in the ANA Board of Governors election, and many of those running for Board seats were there. Also in attendance were columnists from the large numismatic publications and editors of major reference works. Ed Rochette, for whom the ANA's Money Museum is named, attended our class as a student the full week. He had interesting stories to tell from his vast experience in the coin collecting world and long involvement in the ANA. I later learned that Ed was one of the founders of the Summer Seminar program, and had organized the first session in 1969. Ken Bressett, editor of the Red Book also stopped by to visit our class one day, and attended many of the group lunches and events.

Another treat was the opportunity to visit the ANA Money Museum and the ANA Library. The Coins, Crowns & Conflict exhibit had recently opened, with great examples of coinage and other artifacts from the English civil war period. That is an era I'm especially interested in, so the timing of my Colorado Springs visit was perfect. I also spent some time wandering through the library's impressive collection of numismatic books and publications.

Other highlights included the Young Numismatists auction (a lot of spirited competition there!) and the library book sale. Among my purchases at the book sale were some beautifully illustrated auction catalogs that were anywhere from eight to fifteen years old. Amazingly, in one of them I later found a photo of the exact coin I had recently purchased from a dealer.

For extra curricular activities, I signed up for the ANA trip to Pike's Peak and also spent a couple of extra days in Colorado Springs at the end of the seminar to attend the coin show and do some antiquing and sightseeing.

All in all, the Summer Seminar was a very enjoyable experience that I would recommend to others with a strong interest in coin collecting. From it, I gained a better appreciation of the depth and breadth of our hobby. Thank you again to the PNNA and the scholarship committee for promoting this wonderful program, and for giving me an opportunity to participate.

The PNNA board meeting was convened by V.P. Lisa Loos at 5:18 PM at Kent Commons. Also in attendance were Scott Loos, Eric Holcomb, Norm Mikat, Dick Billings, Del Cushing, Danny Bisgaard, Bill McKivor, Bruce Wonder, Mark Gruner, Rob Anglemier, Gawain O'Connor, Bob Busby and Randy Clark.

Minutes of the October board meeting were approved.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u> — See statement for year ending 2007 for details. Cash balance exceeds \$50,000. Report approved.

<u>Old Business</u> — Approved \$50 donation to ANA for spring and summer conventions.

<u>Puyallup Fair</u> — A new coordinator is urgently needed due to Eric's planned move to Oregon. Eric and Lisa will follow up.

<u>Elections</u> — We currently have a full slate except for secretary; get your nominations in to the election chairman.

<u>Convention</u> (April in Tukwila) — Sold out with waiting list. New contracts due to date change. King County Coin Club is host club again. Expand out? Have YN table next

to registration? Relocate exhibits in hallway or racquetball court? — Dick will check with community center. Consider eventually moving to a convention center?

<u>New Business</u> - (1) Motion to appropriate \$1,000 for adult scholarship and \$1,050 for YN scholarship (to attend 2008 ANA Summer Seminar). Passed. (2) Motion (Gruner/Wonder) to authorize \$1,000 for convention YN program. Passed. (3) 2009 ANA spring convention in Portland: First committee meeting has taken place. ANA will reimburse some expenses. Motion (McKivor/ Billings) for \$2,000 seed money from PNNA. Passed. (4) Motion (Cushing/McKivor) to increase ad rates for convention edition of The Nor'wester by approximately 20%. Passed. (5) British token congress in Seattle in April or May 2009. Winning Theme Announced for 2008 National Coin Week

"Money Makes the World Go Round," an original song written, performed and produced by Mark Keefner of West Hills, Calif., was awarded first place in the American Numismatic Association's 2008 National Coin Week theme contest. "Money Makes the World Go Round" is the theme of National Coin Week, held April 20-26.

Keefner receives the contest's grand prize, a one-half ounce gold American Eagle proof coin. Mitch Ernst of Omaha, Neb., also submitted "Money Makes the World Go Round," and receives a one-quarter ounce gold American Eagle proof coin. "Be a History Teacher: Give a Kid a Coin," submitted by Greg Roberts of Glendale, Wis., placed third; Roberts receives a onetenth ounce gold American Eagle proof coin.

"I'm honored and elated to have provided this year's theme," said Keefner, who gave the first-ever musical submission in an ANA theme contest. "As the song says, money is a symbol of value, faith and trust, and teaches us about world history, commerce and art." Plans are under way to integrate Keefner's tune in April's weeklong celebration of numismatics, including making it available at www.money.org.

In October, the ANA announced a contest to its members to determine a National Coin Week theme. Members responded by providing more than 80 submissions to the ANA Board of Governors and staff for consideration. The ANA thanks everyone who submitted a theme idea.

2008 National Coin Week will be a celebration of numismatics, youth and world unity. The ANA is planning a treasure hunt with its member clubs where children will be challenged to find five different numismatic objects, with prizes awarded on local and national levels. Each year during the third full week of April, coin collectors celebrate National Coin Week with exhibits, presentations and other activities designed to convey the fun of collecting and studying coins, paper notes and other forms of money. Past themes have included "Faces of Time" and the 2007 theme, "The Presidents are Coming!"

Prior to founding Simco in 1989, he spent 17 years in the banking and investment community, including 14 years in executive management.

"We are very pleased that Larry has accepted our offer to become the next executive director of the ANA," Stuppler said. "He brings with him extraordinary business experience, and has had an exemplary record of success throughout his career. He is well-respected in the numismatic community with a wellearned reputation for integrity. We look forward to his leadership at this critical time in the ANA's history."

Stuppler, who chaired the Executive Director Search Committee, said Shepherd was their unanimous choice. "Larry stood out among an extremely well-qualified pool of 37 applicants," Stuppler said. "We had a number of extraordinary candidates, and we're obviously very pleased with the results of this search."

Shepherd said he will begin traveling to ANA headquarters in Colorado Springs within a couple of weeks to have meetings with staff, and he expects to begin fulltime duties by mid-tolate spring.

"The ANA is an organization that is vital to the numismatic community, but it's also an organization that has issues and needs help," Shepherd said. "It will take hard work, creative management and fresh ideas to get the ANA back on the right track, and I'm motivated by those challenges."

Shepherd also said that after 18 years as an independent business owner, he had a strong desire to return to management with a large, complex organization. "This fills a void," he said. "I enjoy strategic planning, setting long-term goals and being innovative and creative. This new position gives me a chance to do something I've always wanted to do in the hobby I love and enjoy."

Shepherd will replace Acting Executive Director Ken Hallenbeck, who replaced Chris Cipoletti in October. A search committee consisting of Stuppler, ANA Vice President Patti Finner, Governor Clifford Mishler and General Counsel A. Ronald Sirna, began looking for a new executive director in December.

Talk: "Numismatic Washingtonia (Numismatic items depicting George Washington)" by Eric Holcomb. This illustrated talk will feature many different tokens, medals and coins minted from the 1780's to date depicting the "Father of Our Country," George Washington. The copper piece shown here is a Liberty and Security penny minted in England circa 1795. A number of early Washington tokens were intended as samples for private coinage contracts, however Washington and the newly formed Congress rejected contract coinage, instead establishing the US Mint in 1792. Difficulties with early US Mint operations led to continued speculation about contract coinage into the early 1800's, and indeed the Mint did eventually purchase some of its copper supplies (but not actual coins) from England.

The Alaska and Hawaii quarters, scheduled for release later this year, will conclude the commemorative state quarters originally authorized by Congress, although "In 2009, the United States Mint will mint and issue six quarter-dollar coins in honor of the District of Columbia and the five United States Territories: the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, Guam, American Samoa, the United States Virgin Islands, and the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands." — usmint.gov
