The 88th annual National Coin Week will be April 15-21, 2012.

Local clubs should take this opportunity to enhance their club treasury by preparing an eye popping exhibit and display it in their local community.

#### PNNA Literary Award for Best Club Newsletter

#### **Summer Seminar Scholarship Awards**

The PNNA is offering (two) full one session scholarships for an Adult and a YN (Young Numismatist) collector to attend the 2012 ANA Summer Seminar, held on the campus of The Colorado College in beautiful Colorado Springs, CO. Session I dates are Saturday, June 23, to Friday, June 29; session II, Saturday, June 30 to Friday, July 6, 2012. Summer Seminar is an opportunity for numismatic scholarship and camaraderie offering students a wide and varied selection of weeklong courses suited for anyone from the curious beginner to the most advanced numismatist. The scholarship includes tuition for the class of your choice, a room in Loomis Dormitory (double occupancy), all of your meals (on campus meal plan included in tuition) and airfare reimbursement, up to a maximum value of \$1,000 (\$1,050 for the YN Scholarship due to a mandatory side trip). Young Numismatists (YNs), ages 13 to 22, stay in a Colorado College dormitory with a group of experienced chaperons and mentors. Along with attending classes, YNs participate in a variety of special activities and events. The winner will be either an Adult or YN collector that is a member of the PNNA and completes the application. (If you are not a current member of the PNNA - please submit \$10.00 dues with the application, or \$5.00 YN dues). Deadline for receipt of applications will be March 1, 2012. ## PNNA/Willamette Convention, October 21-23, 2011 in Portland

The Pacific Northwest Numismatic Association (PNNA) and The Willamette Coin Club (WCC) jointly sponsored the annual MINI-CON coin show and convention at the DoubleTree Hotel, Portland, OR, October 21-23, 2011.

"An array of non-collector, youth and family focused outreach programs, exhibits and educational activities highlighted this year's show," remarked Lisa Loos, PNNA President. "We were indeed honored to have ANA Vice President Walt Ostromecki in attendance to once again lead various free public and youth activities which included the ever-popular Kid's Zone Treasure Hunt and Coin Collecting 101 Basics. Walt also held a public forum on Saturday evening for ANAPNNA members, dealers and the public about 'What's Happening Inside Today's ANA.'

In addition, Loos went on to say: "PNNA members James Reinders and YN Katie Reinders each conducted very successful coin-collecting badge workshops for Boy and Girl Scouts, with approximately 40 scouts in attendance on Saturday afternoon. They also spearheaded the youth's outreach drive for numismatic exhibits which did net three entrants, including one first timer."

The show was attended by well more than 600 despite the lingering economic downturn and lower prices in the stock and bullion markets. General Chairman and current WCC President Gene Wiley noted, "We expected a bullion show, but it broke out into a collector-based extravaganza with many dealers reporting lively sales all day Saturday."

Dennis Reed, owner of Lacey Rare Coins, Lacey, WA, observed: "Friday was a slow start with lots of foot traffic, but little buying. Oh but, Saturday, all I can say is WOW! It was a collector-buying bonanza."

Amiee from Bellevue Rare Coins, Bellevue, WA, remarked: "We didn't know what to expect from the public when it came to purchasing certified coins (their massive show inventory included approximately 85% of slabbed and various graded collector coins), but we are sure glad we came to this show."

The Penny Lady, Charmy Harker, Irvine, CA, said: "I did well and was very busy all three days with sales. But the most enjoyment and satisfaction I received came from my participation in Walt's educational kids' treasure-hunt program. I just love engaging and talking with youngsters and families in conversations about coins."

PNNA Exhibit Coordinator and Chief Judge Eric Holcomb reported that there were nearly a dozen cases of outstanding exhibits, with two YN's participating. Best of Show as well as a first place award was captured by YN Katie Reinders (PNNA ANA Summer Seminar Scholarship winner and 2011 Outstanding YN Summer Seminar attendee), with *Happy Birthday Oregon*. Second place honors were claimed by James Reinders, *A Swedish 3 Daler Plate From the Nicobar Wreck*. Third place went to a YN first time exhibitor, Marie Fernandez, *Mint Marks of U.S. Coins*. Judges were Eric Holcomb, Scott Loos and Danny Bisgaard. (A full exhibit report is available on the PNNA website.)

During the PNNA business meeting, President Lisa Loos gave a big kudos to Rick Shultz and Kevin Charbonneau (Rick's wing man), who both manned a PNNA and Numismatic Hobby exhibit and display booth in September during the run of the Puyallup Fair. Membership was reported as up a bit over last year. The January 2011 PNNA-ANA jointly hosted counterfeit detection education seminar was "a sold-out success with 30 participants." PNNA will again sponsor a YN to the 2012 ANA Summer Seminar. A PNNA People's Choice Exhibit Award will be established and instituted at the 2012 PNNA Spring Convention in Tukwila, WA. The Board also voted to establish a coin club newsletter award. A committee was setup to review and update the PNNA bylaws. Nominations for 2012-2014 election of officers are being solicited. The PNNA website (www.pnna.org) has a new look and members can opt for an online quarterly newsletter versus a printed one at a reduced cost, yet to be set.

### **PNNA Board Meeting Minutes**

22 October 2011, Portland, Oregon

Members in Attendance: Lisa Loos, President; Danny Bisgaard, Vice President; Michael Labosier, Secretary; Scott Loos, Treasurer; Mark Gruner, Director; Gawain O'Connor, Director; James Reinders, Director; Rick Schulz, Director; Bruce Wonder, Director.

<u>Members Absent:</u> John Enges, Director; Larry Gaye, Past President; William McKivor, Director; Dale Reubish, Director; Dennis Stevens, Director; Dan Vornbrock, Director.

The board meeting was called to order by President Lisa Loos at approximately 6:15 p.m. In addition to the board members noted above, PNNA Editor and Webmaster Eric Holcomb and ANA Vice President Walter Ostromecki Jr. were in attendance.

The board observed a moment of silence in memory of George Booth and Michael O'Hara, recently deceased members.

Secretary's Report: Mike called for any changes or corrections to the minutes of the July 9, 2011 board meeting minutes as published on the PNNA website. The minutes were approved as published (Danny/James). Mike reported that the PNNA had received an email inquiry from Jeff Shevlin, who asked to give a presentation on his new book at the October convention. Arrangements were made for Jeff to speak.

Treasurer's Report: Scott reviewed the PNNA's 2011 financial activity through September 30. Revenues through the third quarter totaled \$36,039, with expenses of \$33,258. Convention activity accounted for most of both amounts. At September 30 the club held cash balances totaling \$68,809, mostly invested in money market accounts. Included in the cash total was \$2,012 held for future Token Congress use. Fund balances at September 30 consisted of \$57,368 held in the general fund, \$3,700 in the life member fund, and \$7,740 in the Bob Everett Memorial fund. The Treasurer's report was accepted by the board (Mark/Danny).

#### **Committee Reports:**

Convention – Scott reported there was a full bourse for the fall convention and that the first day had been busy. The scout clinic was active, with 15 boy scouts and 15 girl scouts participating. Next year's fall convention has been scheduled for September 28 – 30. Planning has begun for the 2012 annual spring convention in Tukwila. Scott noted that the bourse applications are out and that ANACS may attend. Video recording of numismatic theater presentations is also being considered. Mike will be looking for volunteers to help watch the door and assist with other duties during the convention.

**Membership** – Lisa provided a brief update for Dennis, who was unable to attend. Projects underway include a membership survey and construction of a membership kiosk to be set up at shows. An updated case rental agreement is being drafted by Scott and John. Progress will be reported at the next board meeting.

**Outreach** – Rick reported that the PNNA's participation at the Puyallup Fair was again a big success. He recruited a good line up of volunteers, and about 5,000 foreign coins (30 pounds worth) were given away to visitors. Lisa thanked Rick for his work on the improved display at the fair this year.

**Education** – Scott reported that another seminar offering is under consideration. With changes at the ANA, joint sponsorship may again be a possibility.

Another option would be to co-sponsor a course with the instructor.

**Election** – In Bill's absence, Lisa reminded everyone that elections would be held in March 2012 for the 2012-2014 term. Board members wanting to run for another term will need to notify Bill; inclusion on the ballot is not automatic for current members. Candidates will likely be asked to provide brief biographies for the ballot package.

**Publication** – Eric reported that the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter *Nor'wester* has been issued. The PNNA website is experiencing about 500 page views per day. An update of the speakers' bureau information on the website will come, and a new feature enabling members to receive monthly notifications is being explored. Eric appealed for more articles and other content for the website and for *The Nor'wester*.

**Award** – Danny will be publishing a call for award nominations in the next edition of *The Nor'wester*. The new literary award will be publicized further, with 2012 newsletters to be evaluated for a first award in 2013. Danny, Mark, and Bruce serve on the review committee.

**Exhibit** – Award winners at the fall convention were as follows: Katie Reinders – 1<sup>st</sup> Place and Best of Show for "Happy Birthday Oregon;" 2<sup>nd</sup> Place – James Reinders for "A Swedish 3 Daler Plate from the Nicobar Wreck;" 3<sup>rd</sup> Place – Marie Fernandez for "Mint Marks of U.S. Coins."

#### **Old Business:**

<u>By-Laws review</u> – Rick and Gawain were assigned to review the PNNA by-laws as published on the PNNA website and recommend any suggested changes at the next board meeting. All board members were asked to review the by-laws and send any comments to Rick and Gawain by mid-December.

<u>Branding/Logo</u> – Lisa will follow up with Dennis as to plans for a contest for a new logo design. The board may also consider retaining the Boeing Employees Coin Club medals artist.

<u>Elongated cent machine</u> – No progress to report; Rick will follow up.

<u>Projection Screens</u> – One screen has been purchased for use with the club's digital projectors; Dennis will donate a second.

#### **New Business:**

Walter Ostromecki reported that the ANA is revisiting show site plans. The Portland Convention Center could be considered for the spring 2013 National Money Show if the PNNA and Willamette club were interested in co-sponsoring the event. Previous ANA

shows were held there in 1998, 2004, and 2009. A motion was passed (Scott/Bruce) authorizing the PNNA to send a letter to the ANA in support of holding the spring 2013 National Money Show in Portland if the necessary club commitments are obtained.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 7:20 p.m.

#### **Gregory Paul Franck-Weiby**

March 10, 1950 - November 11, 2011

Memorial Services were held December 3, 2011 for Gregory Paul Franck-Weiby, Silverton-area artist, numismatic master and peace activist who died at about 3 a.m. Friday, November 11, 2011 after suffering a massive stroke the previous Wednesday. He was 61.

He was born March 10, 1950 at Harriman Jones Clinic and Hospital in Long Beach, California, the son of Paul Lauren Weiby and Holly Knill Weiby. His parents divorced when he was about 9 and he was raised by his mother and maternal grandmother, Ivy Knill. When he was in his early teens, his mother became personal assistant and photographer to the explorer and bathysphere inventor, the late Otis Barton. Greg traveled much of the world with his mother as she followed Barton on his explores. Greg spoke often of his time in Europe, especially Granada in Spain and weeks in Addis Ababa in Ethiopia. Greg studied sailing and became knowledgeable about sailing ships of all sorts. In his youth he sailed on an old Norwegian Volksbot which his father owned. All this and more nurtured in him the great artist he would become.

Through all the peace work, Greg was an artist. He made dies and coin dies, hand engraving in steel. Any coin from any place and any period could be placed in his hand and he could immediately, off the top of his head, identify it, give details about its lineage and history. He was for a long time active in Salem-area coin clubs. He was a member of the American Numismatic Association, the Ancient Coin Collectors Guild, the Pacific Northwest Numismatic Association, the American Numismatic Society and the Unrecognized States Numismatic Society. Greg made many of the commemoratives for the PNNA and ANA conventions. Attendees to the ANA coin conventions in Portland will recall the curiously dressed man who put on fantastic demonstrations of ancient Greek, Medieval, and early modern coining techniques.

In most recent years, Greg became well known in numismatic, as well as fantasy gaming, circles for his work with the Shire Post Mint, producing such master works as the "Silver Daler of New Dal," which required more than 340 hours of meticulous, finely detailed engraving of its dies with hand-cut .999 fine silver blanks in authentic 13th century Germanic style. Greg referred to the "Daler of New Dal" as his *Magnum Opus* and from the date of this issue, he most comfortably referred to himself as "an artist."

Most recently, Greg had been working on dies and coins for the HBO series "Game of Thrones," based on the books by George R.R. Martin, with whom he was working. He completed "The Faceless man token" and was working on other Winterfell coinage at his death.

Artistically, Greg was most active in the Society for Creative Anachronism, where he was Ian Cnull (the last name rendered from his mother's maiden name with the 13th century spelling 'Cnulle,' from the Welsh Kenele, meaning "clump of oak trees"). In the SCA, which he

joined in 1989, he became "the Moneyer of Silberbyrg" or, as he was known to many more simply, "the moneyer dude." He honed his Craft, becoming one of the world's leading ancient coiners. He was made a Journeyman of the Moneyers' Guild of the West at An Tir/West War A.S. 26 (1991) and was the first moneying apprentice in An Tir, studying under Wilhelm Dogget of Windy Vale. The following year, he was recognized as 'guildmaster in An Tir.' His petition for incipient status of Moneyers' Guild of An Tir was accepted at May Crown A.S.28 (1994) and he received the Goutte de Sangre at that same event. Later that year, he was made a Master by the Moneyers Guild of the West at An Tir/West War A.S. 28, at which event he received the Royal Commission as 'Moneyer to Kings.' His personal device and Moneyers' 'goat' badge was passed by College of Heralds early the following year.

He began minting in the society, issuing as money changer the copper follis of St. Hildegard \$1 trade coins ("barak bucks") at second Festival of St. Hildegard and became the money changer, issuing king head silver penny \$4 coin at Ducal War A.S. 29 (1995). The Moneyers' Guild of AnTir was officially chartered and Ian/Greg became Minister of the Guild. He introduced 'Byzantine style' gold ('light') tremissis \$20 trade coins as well as the gold florin \$50 trade at the Thirtieth Year Celebration, June A.S. 31 (1997).

It was Ian/Greg who engraved the matrix for the Kingdom Great Seal, issued in May A.S. 32 (1998) and anyone in the society in AnTir who has received an award from Kingdom since that date bears a wax impression of that seal.

Of his many projects, his most ambitious in the society what his replacement in A.S. 40 (2006) of the St. Hildegard coppers with actual medieval Chinese coins and his introduction of medieval style Chinese paper money, for which he engraved the wood chops and designed an create the silk threaded paper. He retired from serving as money changer at the end of the following year. He was elevated to the Laurel at September Crown, A.S. 42 (2008).

All of his work is highly collectable and is listed in *Krause Catalogue of Unusual World Coins*. Two of his coins are on the cover of the present fifth edition.

He enjoyed the company of many apprentices, journeymen and fellow masters and, at his death, was head of the AnTir Branch of the InterKingdom Moneyers' Guild.

Greg and his first wife, whom he tragically lost to a brain tumor in 2001, had no children. In addition to his wife, he was preceded in death by all his known blood relatives, though it is thought he might have some surviving distant cousins on his mother's side, none of whom he knew. In terms of family, he is survived only by his Lady, Karen Kidd. He did, however, in his life, cultivate a wide and extended family of many friends and professional associates, all of whom deeply mourn his too-soon and sudden passing.
