2015 Portland Medal

The ANA National Money Show returns to Portland, Ore., March 5-7, 2015 at the Oregon Convention Center. The PNNA and the WCC, in cooperation with the ANA, are pleased to offer a convention medal depicting *Portlandia* on the obverse and a flying eagle on the reverse.

Portlandia is a sculpture by Raymond Kaskey located above the entrance of Michael Graves' Portland Building in downtown Portland, Oregon, at 1120 SW 5th Avenue. It is the second-largest copper repoussé statue in the United States, after the Statue of Liberty.

Raymond Kaskey, Greg Pettengill and Michael LaSalle built sections of the statue in one of the Maryland suburbs of Washington, D.C., and shipped the parts to Portland by ship. It was assembled at a barge building facility, Gunderson, Inc. It was installed on Oct. 6, 1985, after being floated up the Willamette River on a barge.

The statue is based on the design of the city seal. It depicts a woman dressed in classical clothes, holding a trident in the left hand and reaching down with the right hand to greet visitors to the building.

The statue itself is 34 feet, 10 inches (10.6 meters) high. If standing, the woman would be about 50 feet (15 m) tall. An accompanying plaque contains a poem by Portland resident Ronald Talney.

The statue is above street level, and faces a narrow, treelined street with limited automobile access. Occasionally, there are suggestions to move the statue to a more visible location, but these have come to nothing and the sculptor states that he designed the statue for its location and would not approve of moving it.

It has also been claimed that *Portlandia's* relatively low profile results from sculptor Kaskey's close guarding of his intellectual property. Unlike the Statue of Liberty, *Portlandia* may not be reproduced for any commercial purpose without permission from the artist. The rights to the image of *Portlandia* remain Kaskey's sole property. The Regional Arts & Culture Council maintains the statue.

{ The ANA/PNNA/WCC medal is the first medal that the artist has given permission to use the image. }

Portlandia is a product of Portland's Public Art Program, dedicated to working with the public and private sectors to support art reflecting a wide range of perspectives.

The statue appears in the title sequence of the TV series *Portlandia*.





A limited number of standard Allstate cases will be available if needed. Exhibits can be competitive or non-competitive. Remember that the PNNA best of show winner receives \$200 in assistance to take the winning exhibit to the ANA anniversary convention in the same year. (The 2014 convention is in Chicago.)
